Enjoy life, laugh, go outside and commune with nature. By us being happy, we can spread that to others and will be easily transmitted.

What makes a laughing baby put a smile on your face? It is their sincerity and their innocence of just being happy that makes you happy. In that same manner, we need to be like the baby to bring joy to others through our sincerity. Laughter is contagious.

We all want to help alleviate the suffering of everyone. Some people want help, others don't. Let's start by working on ourselves first, then bring joy to those seeking your help. Then they too can spread joy to others. As Nichiren Shonin stated in his writing Senji-sho, "If the number of the believers increases from two to three and to hundreds, thousands, millions; then, it becomes the huge Mount Sumeru of Buddhahood or the great ocean of nirvana." Let us start building the mountain and filling the ocean.
